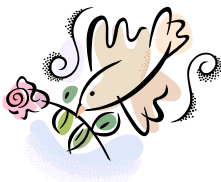

Lesson

¹So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ²Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, ³for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

⁵Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). ⁶On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. ⁷These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. ⁸But now you must get rid of all such things—anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. ⁹Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices ¹⁰and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. ¹¹In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

Sermon Remembering the Saints in Ordinary Time

St. Olaf is considered the patron saint of Norway. In his early career he engaged in war and piracy in the Baltic Sea and Normandy. In Rouen, France he was baptized and became a Christian. He returned to Norway where he succeeded his father as king. Tribal leaders resented his centralized government and Christianization of the people and drove him out of the country. He fought to regain his kingdom but was killed on the battle field at Stiklestad, north of Trondheim on July 29, 1030.
