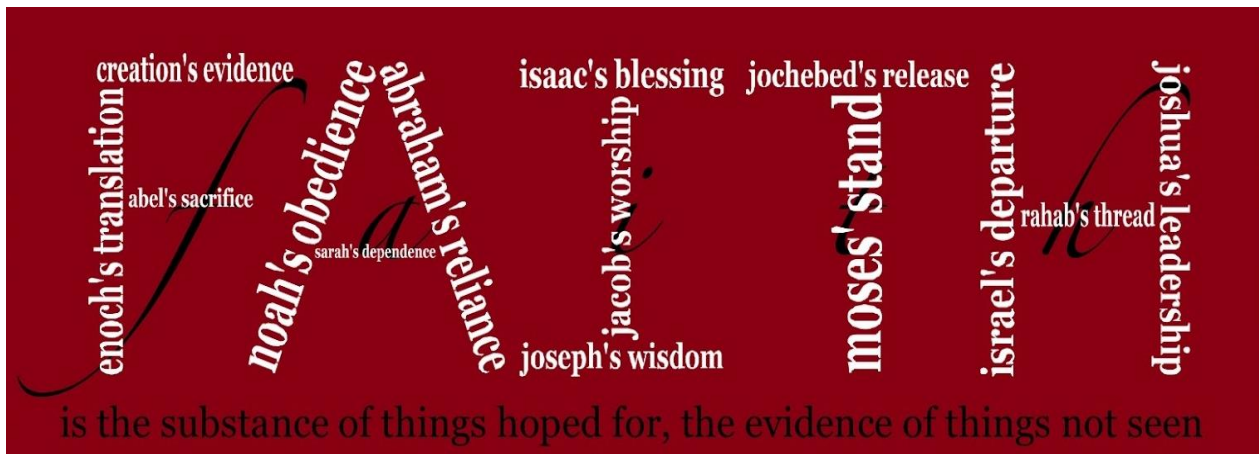


Lake of the Isles Lutheran Church

Throughout the summer, we have listened to the stories of the Old Testament characters, and meditated on their words and deeds. As we begin this fall season, we are reminded that we are called to follow in the example of those who have gone before. We are to keep our eyes on Jesus Christ, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith.



This morning Pastor Haug concludes his sermon series based on the Hebrews 11, often known as “The Hall of Faith.” The chapter recalls the Old Testament characters who lived “by faith.” In the next verses of the Hebrews 12, the author suggests that this is the mighty cloud of witnesses who stand in the “bleachers of heaven” and cheer us on in our faith.

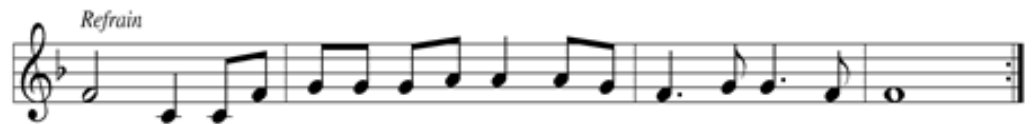

This had been proposed over 20 years ago as a part of the major renovation that included the installation of the elevator. Unfortunately, the renovated bathrooms were cut from the project because of cost. Even today \$70,000 is needed for the work and will take 3 months to complete.
