

Distribution

Communion is by common cup or intinction: For the common cup, receive a piece of the bread, and drink from the white chalice. For intinction dip the bread into the brown cup with the wine (dark) or grape juice (light) as you prefer, then eat. At Lake of the Isles, we practice open communion. All who hunger for the presence of Christ in their life are welcome at this table. Gluten free wafers are available in the silver cup.

(He might even bring a 3D printer with him!) Ben is the Anderson Student Innovation Labs Manager at the U of M. Trained as a mechanical engineer, Ben has spent his career working for university "makerspaces". The U of M's Anderson Student Innovation Labs give students a place to learn technical skills outside of the classroom and the means to work on their projects, whether they're gifts for friends or potentially life changing technology innovations.

Ben's talk will take place after a brief coffee break following the Sunday morning service. Those who are interested will be invited to take their coffee/tea into the Christy Room for about 45 minutes. The first 15-20 minutes will be an informal talk by Ben, leaving the time remaining for questions from those in attendance.
