*Under the kings of Judah, Amon and Manasseh, the worship of other deities especially Baal and Astarte had developed in the Holy City of Jerusalem. Josiah, a dedicated reformer, wished to put an end to the misuse of the holy places. One of the most zealous champions and advisers of this reform was the prophet Zephaniah. The prophet boldly predicted the destruction of Judah for the evil committed by its occupiers, but a remnant would survive until God would come to renew the old world. Zephaniah's passionate word became the origin the Roman Catholic church's **Dies Irae**, the Day of Judgement.*



