

Luke 2: 15-21

St. Luke quickly moves from the story of Jesus' birth to his naming ceremony 8 days later. P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the second chapter.

¹⁵When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. ¹⁷When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; ¹⁸and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.



Refrain: *Oh, the rising of the sun and the running of the deer, The playing of the merry organ, sweet singing in the choir.*


The holly bears a blossom as white as lily flower, And Mary bore sweet Jesus Christ to be our sweet saviour. Refrain




