Today we begin the new church year with the First Sunday of Advent. Advent, which means coming, is a season of hoping, waiting, yearning and preparing, but for what and for whom? In many old Lutheran liturgies, the story of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem was the gospel story read on this Sunday. It was a colorful reminder that it is not simply a baby in Bethlehem entering into our story, but it is a savior who comes in the name of the Lord.

P: Throughout the season of Advent we prepare ourselves to receive the King of glory anew. Therefore, let us come before God with open hearts.





Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.




