





XV Lativan Song & Dance Festival USA

Our Director of Music, Dr. Kris Rizzotto and our Guest Musician, Dr. Ben Alle will participate in the festival, on **June 30th**, in the Sacred Music Concert, along with hundreds of other Latvian musicians.

XV Latvian Song & Dance Festival USA will be held in Minnesota's capital for the first time ever this summer, filling the streets and stages of St. Paul with singing, dancing, and revelry celebrating the culture of Latvia.

Three thousand Latvians –including Krisjanis Karins, Prime Minister of Latvia–to gather for a folk culture celebration five years in the making–and all are invited to join in the fun!

For a traditional Latvian festival experience, visitors will want to check out the following:

- Community Dance & Pig Roast at Harriet Island (Thurs, June 30) Join in easy dances with Latvian-Swedish band Stokholmas Spēlmani and Minnesotan-Latvian band Lini.
- *Grand Folk Dance Show* at the **Xcel Energy Center (Sat, July 2)** More than 700 costumed dancers will turn the arena into a kaleidoscope of traditional and contemporary choreography.
- *Massed Choir Concert* at the Ordway (**Sun, July 3**) The culmination of the festival, with a 500-voice 'grand choir' performing traditional and contemporary arrangements.

To explore Latvian genres beyond folk music, check out:

- *Welcome Concert* at the **Cathedral of St. Paul (Wed, June 29)** A program of music from Latvian composer *Ēriks Ešenvalds*, who will be in attendance for the debut of new work.
- Sacred Music Concert at the Church of the Assumption (Thurs, June 30) with choirs, organists, and instrumentalists.
- Guest Choirs Concert at the **Ordway (Fri, July 1)** Anima, who hail from the coastal town of Saulkrast, perform a lively audio-visual program inspired by the sounds of the Baltic.
- *Chamber and Symphonic Concert* at the **Ordway (Fri., July 1)** The Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra performs rarely-heard Latvian symphonic work.
- Latvian Rock at the **Palace Theatre (Sat, July 2)** After 25 years, Latvian-American new wave/ska/prog-rock band Akacis finally play a reunion show! Latvian indie-rockers Astro'n'out make their American debut, and Riga's own DJ AI-VA closes out the night.
