Call to Worship

Invocation & Prayer Please stand as you are able. The Scriptural Stations of the Cross is an ecumenical Lenten tradition inviting prayer and reflection on Jesus' final days through the visitation of 14 stations, each representing a part of our savior's journey to the grave. The Scriptural Stations is a modern version of the ancient Christian devotion. This version was inaugurated on Good Friday 1991 by Pope John Paul II in Rome's Colosseum.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Dear friends in Christ, again this day, the day in which our Lord died, and rested in death in the kingdom of the dead, we have gathered to hear the story of his selfless and life-giving sacrifice upon the cross. Let us mark, therefore, the events and words of this day which proclaim God's victory and our salvation. Solemnly, may we pass before his cross and contemplate his act of love and mercy, forgiveness and grace.

We will glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ:

In whom is our salvation, our life and our resurrection. Lord Jesus, help us walk in your steps.

Almighty Father, look with loving mercy on this your family for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed, to be given up into the hands of sinners, and to suffer death upon the cross; who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. **Amen.**

A little later the bystanders came over and said to Peter, "Surely you too are one of them; even your speech gives you away." At that he began to curse and to swear, "I do not know the man." And immediately a cock crowed. Then Peter remembered the word that Jesus had spoken: "Before the cock crows you will deny me three times." He went out and began to weep bitterly.

The chief priests with the elders and the scribes, that is, the whole Sanhedrin, held a council. They bound Jesus, led him away, and handed him over to Pilate. Pilate questioned him, "Are you the king of the Jews?" He said to him in reply, "You say so." The chief priests accused him of many things. Again Pilate questioned him, "Have you no answer? See how many things they accuse you of." Jesus gave him no further answer, so that Pilate was amazed.... Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released Barabbas... [and] handed [Jesus] over to be crucified.

Lord, grant us discernment that we may see as you see, not as the world sees. **Amen**.

They cried out, "Take him away, take him away! Crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your king?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar." Then he handed him over to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus, and carrying the cross himself he went out to what is called the Place of the Skull, in Hebrew, Golgotha.

Ninth Station


We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:
