This morning Pastor Haug begins his annual summer sermon series, The Lessons and the Legends of the Apostles. This year he will focus on Jesus' twelve disciples and the traditions attributed to them.

This morning we begin with St. Andrew.

Andrew was the first of the Twelve. He is known as a fisherman who left his net to follow Jesus. As a part of his calling he brought other people, including Simon Peter, to meet Jesus. In the words of St. John Chrysostom, he is known as "The Peter before Peter." Andrew is said to have died on the cross saltire, an X-shaped cross.

His traditional commemoration day is November 30th.

In the heavens he has set a tent for the sun, which comes out like a bridegroom from his wedding canopy, and like a strong man runs its course with joy.


Its rising is from the end of the heavens, and its circuit to the end of them; and nothing is hid from its heat.

<sup>10</sup>For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. <sub>11</sub>The scripture says, "No one who believes in him will be put to shame." <sup>12</sup>For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. <sup>13</sup>For, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."





They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" <sup>39</sup>He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. <sup>40</sup>One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. <sup>41</sup>He first found his brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated Anointed). <sup>42</sup>He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. 




