

This morning Pastor Haug continues his summer sermon series on The Lessons and the Legends of the Apostles. This morning we will meditate on Saint Philip and Saint James the Less, Apostles. Their traditional commemoration date is May 1st.

Saint Philip was one of the first disciples of Jesus, who after following Jesus invited Nathanael to Come and See. According to tradition, Philip preached in Asia Minor and died as a martyr in Phrygia. Saint James, the son of Alphaeus, is called the Less meaning short or younger, to distinguish him from Saint James, the brother of Saint John the Evangelist, the son of Zebedee. Saints Philip and James are commemorated together because the remains of the two saints were placed in the Church of the Apostles in Rome on May 1st in 561.






