

This morning Pastor Haug continues his summer sermon series on the Lessons and Legends of the Apostles. Today we turn to St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist, whose traditional commemoration day is September 21. Matthew, or Levi as he is known in Mark and Luke's gospels, was a tax collector for the Roman government in Capernaum. In the gospels, tax collectors are mentioned as sinful and despised outcasts, but it was these outcasts to whom Jesus showed his love. Matthew's name means "gift of the Lord." Since the second century, tradition has attributed the first gospel to him.




