


This morning Pastor Haug continues his summer sermon series on The Lessons and the Legends of the Apostles. This morning we will meditate on St. Barnabas whose traditional commemoration date is June 11th.

Though Barnabas was not among Jesus' Twelve mentioned in the gospels, the book of Acts gives him the title apostle. He was a wealthy Levite from the island of Cyprus. His name was Joseph, but the apostles gave him the name Barnabas which means "Son of Encouragement." When Paul came to Jerusalem after his conversion on the road to Damascus, Barnabas took him in over the fears and protests of the other apostles. Later Barnabas traveled with Paul on his first missionary journey.

The Word of God comes alive for the gathered community. As God speaks to us in scriptures read, sung and preached.

Lesson Acts 4:32-37 ³² Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common.³³ With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all.³⁴ There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold.³⁵ They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need. ³⁶ There was a Levite from Cyprus, Joseph, to whom the apostles gave the name Barnabas (which means "son of encouragement"). ³⁷ He sold a field that belonged to him, then brought the money and laid it at the apostles' feet.






