The Twelve Days of Christmas are marked by the various commemorations of the early church. Beginning on Christmas Day, the first day of Christmas, December 26th commemorates the death of the first martyr, St. Stephen, December 27th commemorates St. John the Apostle, the author of the gospel that proclaims the Word became Flesh, December 28th, recalls the death of the Holy Innocents, the children slain by King Herod, in his pursuit of the new born king. January 1st commemorates the naming of Jesus, all culminating on January 6th, the feast of the Epiphany and the arrival of the three kings. In the Roman Catholic Church this day is known as the Feast of the Holy Family.







Gospel Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

St. Matthew tells the story of the Holy Family's escape into Egypt. P: The Holy Gospel according to Matthew, the second chapter.

#### C: Glory to you, O Lord.

<sup>13</sup> Now after they had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." <sup>14</sup> Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt 15 and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, "Out of Egypt I have called my son." <sup>19</sup> When Herod died, an angel of the Lord suddenly appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, <sup>20</sup> "Get up, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who were seeking the child's life are dead." <sup>21</sup> Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. <sup>22</sup> But when he heard that Archelaus was ruling Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. And after being warned in a dream, he went away to the district of Galilee. <sup>23</sup> There he made his home in a town called Nazareth, so that what had been spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled, "He will be called a Nazarene."
