Lift up your hearts.


We lift them to the Lord.

Floyd Allen Dahl of Minneapolis, Minnesota, passed away on November 1, 2023 at the age of 93 while residing at The Waters on 50th. He was born on October 29, 1930. He graduated from Southwest High School in 1947 and from the University of Minnesota with an Associate of Arts degree in 1950. He entered the Naval Reserve in 1953 and served at the Naval Reserve Supply Department at the Wold Chamberlain Navy Base. He was discharged in 1959.

On May 26, 1956, Floyd married the love of his life Phyllis Joan Meier at St. John's Lutheran Church in Sumner Iowa. They resided in Minneapolis, and were married for 67 years. They were blessed with two children. Floyd was preceded in death by his parents Walter G. Dahl and Marie Dahl, his brother Walter G. Dahl, Jr., a stillborn daughter and his daughter-in-law Debra K. Dahl.

Floyd is survived by his wife, Phyllis, son Robert of Rochester, Minnesota, daughter Kathryn of Edina, Minnesota, grandson Alex of Rochester, Minnesota, nephew Paul Meier of Denver, Iowa, nieces Janice Meier of Winston Salem, North Carolina, Barbara Meier Koester of New Hampton, Iowa and Jean Lois Meier of Hulbert, Oklahoma. He is also survived by extended family and friends and his granddog, Jameson Joseph.

Floyd spent over 56 years in the banking industry beginning with Midland Bank and staying with the bank through all of its incarnations from Northwestern National Bank and Norwest Bank and ending with Wells Fargo. He retired from Norwest Bank in his mid-50s and after a year or so of retirement, which included a stint delivering newspapers, he was hired through a temp agency to work on a special project at Wells Fargo and ended up working there until he was 82.

Floyd loved airplanes and spent many hours building model airplanes. Many Sundays were spent going to the airport to watch the planes take off and land. He also loved to whistle and was very good at it. You knew everything was right in the world when he was sitting in the dining room working on his planes and whistling. He also loved reading, especially history, mysteries and true stories. He was an expert on World War II history and read every book and magazine he could find on the subject.

Floyd enjoyed spending time with John and Evangeline ("Motz") Anderson and their sons. They treated Floyd like a member of their family. There were many weekends and summer vacations spent with the Andersons up at their cabin which was on an island in Big Sandy Lake.

Floyd was a true homebody. Besides working, he was most happy spending time at home. He took meticulous care of the yard in the summer and shoveled snow in the winter until he was well into his 70s.

Floyd spent the last couple of years residing at The Waters on 50th in their memory care unit. They loved him and took very good care of him so that the family didn't have to worry about his welfare.
