

P: When we were baptized in Christ Jesus, we were baptized into his death. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.




- P: I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church. Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?


